As we take our first steps, I wanted to share some highlights of our progress. Our team met with the Albinism Association of Nigeria, Oyo State chapter, to introduce our initiative

Through them, we connected with parents of children with Albinism to select our beneficiaries.

We reached out to local organizations and individuals to raise funds, which helped cover the registration of Iretiola and the expenses for our pilot project. We also received help from volunteers who shared our vision.



Pilot project

Our pilot project aimed to empower children with Albinism through a four-day workshop held in Ibadan, Oyo State, Nigeria, in February 2024. The workshop focused on building self-awareness, confidence, and inclusion among children with and without Albinism, helping them integrate into society. It was an exciting beginning for Iretiola and the energetic beneficiaries, aged 10 to 18, from diverse backgrounds and religions. They worked together during the workshop without discrimination. One parent shared how their child's confidence grew after attending the workshop,

saying, "Before, due to fear, I used to stop my son from participating in certain activities. Now, after meeting other children at the workshop, he confidently tells me to encourage him to do what he likes. I'm no longer sad." This highlights the positive impact of our engagement.

None of this would have been possible without your support, and we're deeply grateful.
